It sounds interesting to know that all these are considered in framing an effective tender document. I am really keen to know more.





Adequate publicity to the NIT has to be given. It has to be posted on organisation's website as well as on Central Public Procurement Portal that is CPP portal.




The committee to open the tender has to be duly notified by the competent authority and the tenders shall be opened in the presence of bidders or their authorised representative.




Another important aspect is that an appropriate Tender Evaluation Committee comprising members competent to deal with the subject matter has to be constituted.

PUBLIC PROCUREMENT

- Government bodies spend a sizeable amount of their budget on procurement of goods, works and services.
- These procurements are made by following transparent, uniform, systematic and cost-effective procedures of tendering.
- These procedures are in the form of instructions and guidelines of the Government on public procurement.
- Comprehensive Rules and Regulations in this regard are available in the General Financial Rules (GFR), 2017.
- Also, Department of Expenditure, Government of India has prepared a set of three Manuals on policies and procedures for Procurement of Goods, Works and Consultancy and other Services.
- All procurement related instructions issued by Central Vigilance Commission have been subsumed into these Manuals.
- The Manuals are available on websites of Department of Expenditure and Central Vigilance Commission at https://doe.gov.in and https://cvc.gov.in respectively.
- The Ministries/Departments are advised to align their Procurement Manuals in line with the DOE's Manuals.
- Regular training sessions are being organized by the government bodies to impart training/update the officials on Public Procurement.
